## Assistant Professor Position in Criminal Justice (2013-2014)

The Department of Criminal Justice and Homeland Security at Indiana University Kokomo invites applications for a full time, tenure-track position beginning August 1, 2013. Teaching course load will be 3 courses per semester. We are looking for someone to teach Corrections, American Policing and/or Criminal Law along with other courses consistent with the successful candidate's training and teaching experience that would contribute to the delivery and needs of our program. Candidates should also have an ongoing research agenda which leads to publication. Appropriate related service at the campus, university, professional, and/or community levels is also expected as a part of this position.

Preferred candidates will have an earned doctorate in criminal justice. Although those who are ABD and will earn a doctorate in criminal justice within two years of his/her initial appointment will also be considered. ABDs will have until November of the second year to earn the doctorate. Candidates must also have a master's degree in criminal justice or a closely related field. Candidates are expected to be both effective teachers and active scholars. Experience teaching at the college level, commitment to diversity, a strong interest in student mentoring, and experience teaching online are also preferred.
