ADMISSIONS STANDARDS

Applications for admission to Indiana University Kokomo are accepted and reviewed on a rolling basis. Applicants should forward required documents before the appropriate application deadline. The deadline for each semester is approximately three weeks prior to the start of the term.

To be admitted unconditionally, you must meet the following criteria:

1. Academic Honors or Core 40 diploma, at least 30 college preparatory high school courses (Students with a GED may still be considered for admission)
2. At least 950 on the SAT (critical reading and mathematics portion) or 20 on the ACT (not required for students who have been out of high school for more than three years)
3. Students should rank in the upper-half of their class.

High school preparatory courses should include at a minimum:

- 8 semesters of English (literature, speech, composition)
- 6 semesters of mathematics (algebra, geometry, algebra II)
- 4 semesters of laboratory science (biology, chemistry, physics)
- 4 semesters of social science (history, government, economics, psychology, sociology)
- 8 semesters in some combination of foreign language, additional math, laboratory science, social science, or computer science.

Students, who do not meet all the criteria, may still be admitted conditionally. Contact the admissions office for more information.

To be admitted as a Transfer student, you must meet the following criteria:

- Students must have 13 or more college level credits with cumulative GPA of 2.0 or above
- Students with a GPA less than 2.0 or who have been dismissed the last semester at their previous college are required to submit a Petition for Admission. Contact the Office of Admissions for specific information.
- Students with less than 13 transferable credits are also required to meet the admission standards of a beginning student.

Payment Disclosure: By sending a check for payment, you are authorizing Indiana University to use information from your check to make a one-time electronic debit from your account at the financial institution indicated on your check. This electronic debit will be for the amount of the check and will post to your bank account within one day of receipt by us. The canceled check will not be returned with your checking account statement. If we cannot post the transaction electronically, you authorize us to present an image copy of your check for payment. You agree that if a third party submits a check on your behalf, that individual is your agent and was provided with these disclosures. How to Apply

1. Fill out a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA – available at www.fafsa.ed.gov). Indiana residents applying for state aid must submit their FAFSA in time for the U.S. Department of Education to receive it no later than March 10 for the following academic year. CVO (Child of Deceased/Disabled Veteran or Officer) recipients must submit a FAFSA annually.
2. To qualify for any IU Kokomo Scholarship, you must be admitted by March 1 for priority consideration. Additional scholarship information is available at <http://www.iuk.edu/~kofinaid>. If you are awarded an outside scholarship, submit a copy of your award letter to the IU Kokomo Financial Aid Office (FAO) as soon as possible.
3. Reapply every year to be considered for financial aid. Awards based upon the submission of the FAFSA are only for one academic year and the following summer.

Words to the Wise

- Apply early.** The priority date to apply for financial aid is **March 10**. The priority admission date for IU Kokomo scholarships is **March 1**.
- Read carefully.** Be sure to respond fully to all questions on forms.
- Stay involved.** You are the first beneficiary of your education. Funding your education is more important to you than anyone else, so take the initiative to be sure all paperwork is done correctly and has been received.
- Ask questions.** Never hesitate to ask a question. A simple question may alert the Financial Aid Office (FAO) about your eligibility for additional aid.
- Respond to requests promptly.** Whenever additional information or documentation is required, no further action can be taken on your financial aid award until that information is received. Delays may keep you from knowing how much aid you will receive before you register for classes and may result in late registration fees.
- Keep records.** Keep copies of your financial aid documents that may be requested.

Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for financial aid, you must meet the following criteria:

1. You must be a U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen. Students who have permanent resident status must provide alien registration information on the FAFSA.
2. You must be regularly admitted to or enrolled in a degree granting program or working toward an “undecided” undergraduate degree. Students who choose to pursue a second undergraduate degree are not eligible for grant assistance, but may receive loans.
3. Financial aid for students enrolled in study abroad or distance education programs or for students enrolled simultaneously at multiple campuses will require special procedures. Please contact the FAO at least two months before the start of the semester for more details on these programs.
4. You must meet Satisfactory Academic Progress standards.

Award Notification

Financial aid award notifications are sent to entering students beginning in early April. All awards based on your FAFSA information are subject to change after your actual enrollment. State aid notifications are sent separately.

Disbursement of Aid Funds

With the exception of Federal Work-Study, all financial aid will be credited to your account with the University. After paying tuition and mandatory fees, any aid awarded in excess of those charges will be sent to you in the form of a check or direct deposit.

Federal Work-Study Program

Students who have sufficiently documented need and indicate an interest in student employment may benefit from the Federal Work-Study Program. Jobs under this program are located on campus.

Loans

Three major Federal education loan programs are the Perkins Loan, Stafford Loan, and the Parent Plus Loan. These loans require the submission of a FAFSA. Parents who wish to borrow additional funds can apply for a Parent Plus Loan by filling out the form on the IU Kokomo Financial Aid Web site.

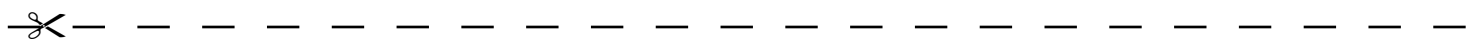
