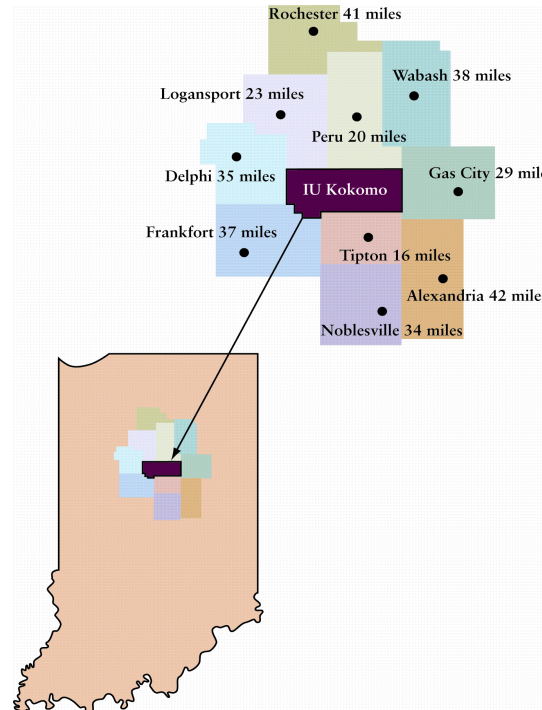

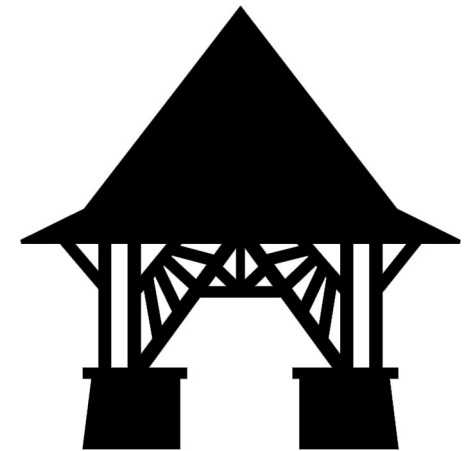

Application Process

Beginning Students

Program Features

The Division of Education at Indiana University Kokomo offers a B.S. in Secondary Education degree program. This program is designed for those students seeking to become middle school and/or high school teachers and includes the following key features:

- * A **cohort approach** composed of teacher candidates progressing through the program of study together, from entrance into the teacher education program through graduation
- * **Small class size** to allow for higher degrees of individual mentoring and instructor-student interactions
- * Program is grounded in **diverse field experiences** in a variety of settings at the middle school/junior high and high school level
- * Program is tailored to meet the **Indiana Office of Licensing and Development (OELD)** both content and developmental in the areas of knowledge, performance, and dispositions, **Interstate New Teacher Assessment and Support Consortium (INTASC) Standards** and **National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE) Standards**
- *The initial teacher education program is **fully accredited at the state (OELD) and national (NCATE) level** and licensure programs have been approved by the Indiana Department of Education
- * **Technology integration** throughout the program, to include the development of teacher candidate **electronic portfolios**, aligned to Division of Education, Indiana OELD, and NCATE standards

B.S. in Secondary Education Curriculum

The 124-hour program of study for the B.S. in Secondary Education degree includes three major categories of course requirements. The curriculum includes a common general education core, content courses within the teaching major, and a professional education sequence of courses. Students may select from one of two different licensure tracks: middle school/junior high (grades 5-9), in which they select any two teaching content areas; or secondary (grades 5-12), in which they select one teaching content area for licensure.
