Master of Science in Education Degree Program

Admission Requirements

The M.S. in Education degree is an advanced teacher education program, closely aligned with National Board for Professional Teacher Standards (NBPTS). This degree program is intended for experienced classroom teachers who seek to become more accomplished practitioners. All applicants' admission materials are reviewed by the Division of Education's Graduate Program Council. The Council recommends or denies admission of each applicant based upon the following criteria:

All applicants must show evidence of:

- Completion of a baccalaureate degree at an accredited institution.
- Completion of an initial teacher training program (in either a baccalaureate-level or as a post-baccalaureate licensure program) at an accredited institution.
- Minimum overall baccalaureate degree GPA and initial teacher education program GPA of 3.00 (on a 4.0 scale) or minimum Graduate Record Exam (GRE) scores of 900 combined verbal/quantitative and 3.5 analytical writing. (Review [GRE – FAQs](#) for more information)
- Minimum score of 6 points on the Personal and Professional Statement. (Personal and Professional guidelines can be downloaded from the Education website)
- Minimum score of 8 points on the interview with members of the Graduate Program Council. (Interview Protocol can be downloaded from the Education website)
- Minimum of two years of successful P-12 classroom teaching at the time you begin the program.
- Full- or part-time employment as a P-12 classroom teacher while enrolled in the program.
- At least two professional letters of reference satisfactorily recommends the applicant for admission into a master's-level program. (See Application Instructions for details)

All **Master of Science in Education** degree applicants with an overall baccalaureate degree GPA and initial teacher education program GPA below 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) are required to take the **Graduate Record Examinations (GRE)** from the **Educational Testing Service (ETS)**.

What is the GRE?

The **Graduate Record Examinations® (GRE®) General Test** measures verbal reasoning, quantitative reasoning, and critical thinking and analytical writing skills that have been acquired over a long period of time and that are not related to any specific field of study.

Which GRE test do I take?

Although ETS offers both the GRE General Test and GRE Subject Tests, IU Kokomo Division of Education only requires the GRE General Test for admission into the M.S. in Education.

Is it a paper test or on computer?

In the United States, the GRE General Test is a computer-based exam.

How much does it cost?

EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2009, THROUGH JUNE 30, 2010

\$150 **General Test—U.S., U.S. Territories*, and Puerto Rico**

What score do I need?

For admission into the IU Kokomo Division of Education's M.S. in Education degree program, minimum GRE scores are 900 combined on verbal/quantitative and 3.5 on analytical writing.

How do I send the scores to IU Kokomo?

You will be able to indicate on the computer-based exam where you would like the scores to be sent.

How long does it take for IU Kokomo to receive my scores?

If you take the computer-based General Test, you can view your unofficial Verbal and Quantitative scores at the test center; however, because of the essay scoring process, you will not be able to view your Analytical Writing scores at that time. Verbal, Quantitative and Analytical Writing scores on the computer-based General Test will be sent to you and the institutions you designate within 10 to 15 days of your test administration.

How do I register?

There are three ways you can register for the computer-based General Test.

Web Through an online registration (credit card only)

Phone Call the test center directly or the Prometric® Candidate Services Call Center Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. - 8 p.m., Eastern Time (New York), (excluding holidays), at 1-443-751-4820 or **1-800-GRE-CALL** (1-800-473-2255).

A confirmation number, reporting time, and the test center address will be given to you when you call.

Mail Download and complete the Authorization Voucher Request Form (PDF) found in the Bulletin on the ETS website.

Mail the appropriate payment and voucher request form to the address printed on the voucher, allowing up to four weeks for processing and mail delivery.

When you receive your voucher, call to schedule an appointment.

An appointment to test must be made prior to the expiration date on the voucher.

If you lose your voucher, contact the GRE® Program. Only one replacement will be issued.

Requests for nonstandard testing accommodations must be made through ETS®.
