There are several scholarships designed to assist Indiana University Kokomo education students that plan to student teach during the 2010/2011 school year. To be eligible, the applicant must have been a full-time undergraduate student during the year prior to student teaching or have earned at least half of the total college credits at IU Kokomo. The name of each scholarship and the specific criteria are detailed below.

Division of Education Elementary Education Fund

- 1. One Award, \$500.00
2. Overall GPA of 2.5 or higher
3. Elementary education major

Kay Plew Memorial Student Teaching Scholarship

- 1. One Award, \$500.00
2. Overall GPA of 2.5 or higher
3. Elementary, Early Childhood, or Secondary education major

Pi Lambda Theta, Patricia Wood Student Teaching Scholarship

- 1. Two Awards, \$225.00 each
2. Overall GPA of 3.2 or higher with minimum 3.5 in all education classes
3. Elementary, Early Childhood, or Secondary education major
