### **Electronic Resources**

**[Academic Search Premier](#)**

Multi-disciplinary database that indexes and includes full-text to scholarly publications covering academic areas of study including social sciences, humanities, education, computer sciences, engineering, language and linguistics, arts & literature, medical sciences, and ethnic studies.

### [America: History and Life](#)

A complete bibliographic reference to the history of the United States and Canada from prehistory to the present.

### [Criminal Justice Abstracts](#)

Indexes criminal justice topics which include crime trends, crime prevention and deterrence, juvenile delinquency and juvenile justice, police, courts, punishment and sentencing, and victimology. Indexes reports from government and non-governmental agencies, books, dissertations, and unpublished papers.

### [CQ Researcher](#)

The **CQ Researcher** is the choice of researchers seeking original, comprehensive reporting and analysis on issues in the news. The single-themed **CQ Researcher** report offers in-depth, non-biased coverage of political and social issues, with regular reports on topics in health, international affairs, education, the environment, technology and the U.S. economy.

**GPO Access** is a Web site provided as a service of the U.S. Government Printing Office. **GPO Access** provides free electronic access to information products produced by the Federal Government.

### [NewsBank NewsFile Collection](#)

Contains full-text news articles covering social, economic, environmental, government, sports, the arts, people, health and science issues and events from more than 500 U.S. regional and national newspapers, wire services, and broadcasts.

### [North American Immigrant Letters, Diaries, and Oral Histories](#)

Provides a unique and personal view of what it meant to immigrate to America and Canada. The materials begin around 1840 and extend to the present, focusing heavily on the period from 1920 to 1980. The database includes personal narratives including letters, diaries, pamphlets, autobiographies, and oral histories. Several thousand pages of Ellis Island Oral History interviews, indexed and searchable, are included.

### [Opposing Viewpoints Resource Center](#)

A source for information on social issues. Access viewpoint articles, topic overviews, statistics, primary documents, links to Web sites, and full-text magazine and newspaper articles.

### [Sociological Abstracts](#)

Indexes the international literature in sociology and related disciplines in the social and behavioral sciences. Provides abstracts of journal articles, books, book chapters, dissertations, and conference papers, as well as citations to book reviews.

### [TOPICsearch](#)

Covers social, political and economic issues, scientific discoveries and other popular topics. Contains full-text documents as well as selected full-text articles for U.S. newspapers.
