ENGAGE: an early college experience for high school students

Purpose: *ENGAGE* is a program to encourage high school seniors to enhance their preparation for college by enrolling in a college course(s) while still in high school. First semester college freshmen often have difficulty in transitioning to the college classroom where instructional delivery, out-of-class assignments, tests, and grading can be different from high school. Completion of a single college course prior to beginning full-time college study can make a substantive difference in contributing to college readiness. The *ENGAGE* Program is designed to be a “bridge” from high school to college.

Curriculum: Several college courses [reverse side] have been identified that are typical first-year courses required by most colleges and universities. The faculty teaching these courses have been selected because of their experience in teaching first-time college students and their commitment to student success. The courses scheduled at morning and afternoon times generally are filled with traditional-age students [age 18-24] and therefore should provide a comfortable environment for students enrolled in *ENGAGE*.

Admission: All students in *ENGAGE* must apply for admission and meet academic standards that are similar to requirements for students desiring to enroll in an IU Kokomo degree program. The principal criteria reviewed are: 1) high school class rank [or home school], 2) SAT/ACT scores, and 3) college preparatory curriculum. Applicants should rank in the upper half of their class, have standardized test scores expected for a college-bound student, and be enrolled in a Core 40 or Academic Honors Diploma curriculum. An equally important criterion is recommendation by a high school guidance counselor.

Counselor Recommendation: *ENGAGE* is limited to 25 students both fall and spring semester. Area high schools have been allocated “seats” and therefore have some discretion in determining the students that will benefit most from this experience. The University expects local high schools to recommend students that have expressed interest in Indiana University Kokomo or who are undecided about college.

Cost: Each *ENGAGE* participant will receive a \$200 scholarship equal to approximately 40 percent of the regular tuition cost. In 2006-07 an *ENGAGE* student would pay \$269 for a 3 credit hour course that regularly costs \$469. Books, fees, and parking are extra.

Enrollment: High school students accepted into the *ENGAGE* Program will be assigned an academic advisor from IU Kokomo’s University Division. Students will participate in an Orientation and will be assisted with course registration. The orientation/registration component and assignment of an advisor is intended to replicate what students will experience as entering college freshmen.

Information: Students interested in the *ENGAGE* Program should contact their Guidance Counselor about eligibility and recommendation to participate. Additional information is available from the IU Kokomo Admissions Office.
